

# **BSc (Hons) Midwifery**

# **Additional Course Costs**

There are costs associated with all studies, additional to the tuition fee, which require consideration, when planning and budgeting for expenditure. Costs are indicative and for the total length of the course shown unless otherwise stated and will increase with inflation; depending on the programme they may include equipment, printing, project materials, study trips, placement activities, DBS and/or other security checks.

Additional course costs for BSc (Hons) Midwifery are outlined below:

## **Books and other texts**

Students will be required to purchase texts and journals to support their study programme. The minimum, average cost of books for students studying on a degree course is assumed as £100 per year. This however will be reduced as much as possible by us providing as many online copies of journals, and texts as is available.

# **Printing**

There is not a specific requirement to print anything, other than for your own notes, or own use. Some students like to print off the PowerPoints to make notes.

#### Uniform

You will be provided with a uniform to wear on placement, enough to suffice. Should you wish to purchase more uniforms, this is an option at an extra cost to yourselves. You can be advised of the cost dependent upon which piece of uniform you require.

In addition, you will need some comfortable black, wipeable shoes that you can wear for long shifts. These can cost around £60 if using the Clarks loops that lots of students wear. Trainers with canvas tops and crocs are not permitted.

Also a smart black cardigan for when in community to go over your uniform will be required, this does not have any specifics and therefore you can choose from your own retailer of choice. A long coat to cover uniform in a dark colour would also be preferable when working in community.

### **Accessories**

Some students like to purchase their own stethoscope, which is not essential, however if you do, seek advice before purchasing. A fob watch which can cost around £10 will be required to wear on your uniform also.

## Graduation

Graduation costs per student are estimated at £100 - £200 total. This is an optional cost for all students, as attending graduation is not a requirement in order to have a degree conferred.
